## No one can do it alone

Grace Hill's collective impact model works with top-notch St. Louis organizations toward long-term, measurable community change. And what a difference it makes! We are grateful for our many partners and their work to enable healthy, productive lives across St. Louis.

We collaborate with other organizations that advance the educational, economic, and social systems that affect our neighborhoods. From Head Start and school partnerships to family finances and community leadership, our partners are essential as we work together to transform our city. Take a look at the instrumental efforts of some of our MVPs (Most Valuable Partners).



The St. Louis Community Credit Union (SLCCU) committed to being involved in our community when they opened a branch in the Water Tower Hub in 2011. Their presence significantly decreased the impact of predatory lenders, allowing people to borrow responsibly and save for the future. Today, they have successfully processed well over a million dollars in loans at our College Hill branch, helping the neighborhood move forward. In 2014, Prosperity Connection — a nonprofit affiliate of SLCCU — began offering free one-on-one financial coaching and money management education, increasing credit scores for Grace Hill families and setting them on the path toward long-term growth.



Connections to Success works "to break the cycle of poverty through hope, resources and a plan." They moved into the Grace Hill Water Tower Hub in 2012 to increase employment and training opportunities in our community. Their extraordinary success shows that this partnership has the ability to truly transform our neighborhoods. Through programs like its Personal and Professional Development training, Connections to Success provides critical career skills and job placement for our neighbors who are working toward their

own success. In 2014, Connections to Success received a grant to serve more men in the College Hill neighborhood, which suffers from high unemployment. This strong partnership strikes poverty at its root, helping neighbors find employment, access critical services, and build a stronger future together.



Most of our Head Start children graduate from our centers and walk into a kindergarten classroom in St. Louis Public Schools (SLPS). Knowing that Grace Hill is working toward long-term impact — and that a quality education takes far more than early childhood our staff has been working with SLPS to form a pipeline that ensures kids are ready for kindergarten, family health and finances are strong, and teams of professionals share accountability for student success. At Clay and Bryan Hill Elementary Schools around the Water Tower Hub, Grace Hill Family Mentors are embedded within the school to enhance enrollment, decrease mobility, address behavior concerns and impact academics. Because of a strong partnership with SLPS services, these children and their families can thrive.
